

ARMTHORPE ACADEMY PHSE Improvement and Development Plan 2020-21



Context of PHSE within the academy

(to cover staffing, subjects taught, brief overview of outcomes etc)

All year groups are allocated one hour of curriculum time a week is designated to citizenship. Within this RSE, PSHE, British values, RE and careers is taught.

British values have not previously been covered in much detail across the curriculum, therefore this year there is a big emphasis on students learning about British values and embedding it across the curriculum. This is taught in the first half term for all year groups so they understand the basics and then taught in more detail across the years and through other subjects when appropriate.

Staff are used from a variety of different subject back grounds, where possible it is staff with a background of social sciences or science that are teaching citizenship and therefore are more confident in teaching the more difficult RSE topics. Lessons are planned for them so that the correct content is covered, however they are expected to differentiate to suit their class.

All topic from the national curriculum are covered with a spiral curriculum design, meaning that they may be covered in year 7 and then more content is added in the following terms and years to ensure a broad and in depth curriculum is taught to our students.

The end point for the citizenship curriculum is, 'To develop students into well rounded citizens who can understand how to keep themselves, and others, physically and mentally safe and healthy throughout life, in a wide range of settings and situations.' This should be achieved by all students by the end of yr11 so that they can learn how to help themselves and hopefully put relieve pressure on services such as the NHS.
