Paracetamol Distribution in School

We are seeing an increasing number of students asking for paracetamol during school time. Although we welcome the resilient attitude of continuing to attend school whilst not feeling 100%, our main office at times bares a resemblance to a pharmacy. If your child is feeling off-colour, please ensure they take paracetamol at 8am before starting school. If they continue to feel unwell, we will contact home after 12pm to re-administer with your consent, but we will not be ringing parents before this time unless it is clearly an emergency or a child who is genuinely in need. Our records show there is a pattern of students regularly missing learning to sit unwell in the main office, hence the change to our policy. If the pattern continues, we will be inviting individual parents into school to discuss newly emerging 'medical' needs noted in school that may need referring to the school nurse.

Encouragingly, we know they have been working much harder in their own time, which is already paying dividends.
