- French speaking exams will take place during reading on a 1:1 basis with Miss Gray. French students will be given individual times in their French lessons.
- There will be no examinations in this window for Performing Arts, Art and Design or Sports Studies students. This is either because the exam component has already been sat, or because coursework components are currently being taught hence an exam at this time would be inappropriate.
- Breakfast will be provided (free of charge) for all students from 8am onwards during each day of the exam period. The activity studio will be for the sole use of Year 11 during this time, so the year group have a quiet indoor space each morning in which to prepare.
- It is imperative students are sat in the activity studio and registered by 8:25 each morning. To help our students, the exam timings have been scheduled to avoid disturbances at break and lunch times. If students are late, they will be allowed entry into the exam, but additional time will not be given.
- Full exam regulations will apply:
 - Students will need a clear pencil case.
 - Bottles of water can be taken into the exams but labels must be peeled off.
 - Mobile phones and wrist watches must not be 'on person' in the exam room. Students will be able to leave their belongings in the activity studio. All exams will take place in the Sports Hall unless access arrangements are in place.
