


# Readling



### **Our Daily Reciprocal Reading Strategy**

<u>Predict</u> - Before starting the reading, students are asked to predict what they think will happen in the next chapter/extract of the text. They may be prompted with the title name, images or quotations.

<u>Clarify</u> - In order to make sure students get the most out of their reading, words that they may not have encountered before are clarified allowing for better understanding of language and meaning.

<u>Question</u> - Throughout their reading session, students are questioned on understanding and meaning of the extracts read. This presents students with the chance to create their own questions and develop their own thinking.


<u>Summarise</u> - Finally, students are asked to summarise information they have read, whether this be in a short paragraph, bullet points or sometimes images. This aids in consolidating learning and allowing students time to recall and think chronologically.

## Year 7


