It has been a busy week in school this week working with our partners in the community. After a day spent working hard with staff to improve coursework and revise for option subjects, Year 11 finished the day on Wednesday with a competitive team building session with George Fouche. Prior to this, we were fortunate to have a production company in school to enable our Year 11 students to see a visual representation of 'A Christmas Carol', one of the texts which they are studying for GCSE English Literature. The English department were thrilled with the quality of the production, which helped students to reinforce their knowledge and understanding of plot, characters and themes throughout the play. Students now need to build upon this experience by ensuring they are revising key quotations at home and practising examination questions.
