2021 GCSE Results

As you are aware, in light of the COVID pandemic, your son/daughter will not be sitting examinations this year. Instead, Teacher Assessed Grades (TAG) will be used to award GCSE grades this Summer. I have spoken at length to our Year 11 cohort about this process, so your child is fully aware of the contents of this letter. The vast majority of Year 11 have been fantastic, showing great maturity and resilience in what has been a challenging and unprecedented time for everyone.

The Process

The process this year is very different to last year. Schools must provide a raft of evidence for each student to justify every grade awarded. Although this is an extremely time-consuming process, it is a process which we welcome, as it ensures consistency and equity for all students. Quite simply, if students have worked hard and they have the evidence to justify, they will be awarded the grades they deserve. To ensure consistency across the country, every school has been asked to write a Centre Assessed Policy; our policy is attached along with the JCQ guidance for all parents and carers.

In addition to this standard documentation, I have written three further documents bespoke to Armthorpe to help you understand the level of detail, thought and care that has been put into our process:

- Internal Timeline: This document shows incremental deadlines we have set to meet the final June deadline.
- Departmental Evidence, Moderation and Rationale: This document details the evidence which individual departments will use at Armthorpe for all students, but also why this range of evidence has been chosen and how it will be moderated to ensure grades are awarded fairly. This information has/is being shared with students this week. It is important to note, evidence used is not negotiable. Please rest assured the range of evidence chosen will demonstrate our students at their best.
- Candidate Declaration Form: This document has been signed by your child to evidence that all work is their own.
 We had an assembly on Monday; students listened intently whilst I explained the process to them.

What next?

The next six weeks are crucial, as time is being used in lesson to finish formulated valuable evidence. Students are understandably becoming tired; resilience is required at this time. Normally students would be sitting up to five hours of exams per day and then having to revise on evenings and weekends at home. Although the Teacher Assessed Grades (TAG) provide different pressures, the students are in control. Please encourage your son/daughter to keep working hard in their lessons.

All grades will be submitted by Friday 18th June. Please note teachers are not allowed to discuss grades with students. Students and parents should not ask. Results will be distributed using a 'normal' results day on Thursday 12th August 2021. More information will follow nearer the time.
